Having launched in December 2019, The Ashley Lashley Foundation has cemented its commitment to social development matters such as, environmental justice, health and wellness, and women's and children rights. The Foundation uses its voice to bring greater awareness of major environmental and health issues affecting Small Island Developing States, namely the health impacts of climate change.

Over the years, The Ashley Lashley Foundation has embarked on several projects, using each as a reminder to you to Let No Obstacle Be Greater Than the Cause. These projects began with the start of the Schools Against Non-Communicable Diseases followed by the Global Youth Network Summit in 2018 and has been an annual event since seeing themes relating to Non-Communicable Diseases, Sustainable Development Goals, Climate Change and Health, and Sports for Climate Action. Moreover, 2020 saw the foundation launched its second major project, The HEY (Healthy and Environmentally Friendly Youth) Campaign and Eco Active Youth in 2022.


